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Introduction

1-1. Description

HD Encodulator[™] is professional Video / Audio Encoder which has DTV broadcasting modulator using A/V compression and digital modulation technologies. MPEG-2 / H.264 technologies were supported for Video compression and MPEG-1 L2 / AC3 / AAC / HE-AAC technologies were supported for Audio compression. For the video input, this product has HDMI, HD-SDI, Component ports and HDMI, HD-SDI, Analog Stereo Audio (L/R), SPDIF (optical/coaxial) and AES/EBU for audio input. And for the encoder and modulation output, this product has ASI and Ethernet ports and RF output port.
